#### From the Director's Desk....

As we present the Annual Report for the year 2023-2024, it gives me great pleasure to reflect on the significant progress made by the National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD) in its mission to deliver dedicated training and research initiatives in empowering women and children. NIPCCD, an autonomous organization under the aegis of Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India has made notable developments in implementing strategic reforms to address the evolving needs of women and children amidst the shifting socio- economic landscape. Our focus has remained on delivering high-quality training, counselling, and research to strengthen women empowerment and child development programs.

- 2. At NIPCCD, we are committed to promoting creativity, encouraging innovation, and driving positive change in the areas of women and child development. Our training programs are designed not just to inform but to equip our stakeholders with the knowledge, skills and values needed to create an inclusive and healthy society. Delivered by experts and field practitioners, these training programs inspire participants to think critically, explore new perspectives and empower communities.
- 3. Throughout the year, NIPCCD has successfully conducted over 678 training programs, both online and offline mode, which have been attended by 28526 government officials and members of civil society organizations. These initiatives have been central to enhancing the capacity of key stakeholders aligned with the core objectives of Mission Sakskam Anganwadi & Poshan 2.0, Mission Vatsalya and Mission Shakti. These efforts have helped improve the effectiveness of services and create a more inclusive environment for women and children across the country.
- 4. Committed to capacity building, NIPCCD runs a one-year full-time Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling (ADCGC) in affiliation with Sri Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University and recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India, with the 19th batch of 31 students currently enrolled. Demonstrating its commitment to regional needs, the Guwahati Regional Centre also inaugurated a one-year ADCGC program in affiliation with Gauhati University on October 20, 2021, and currently run a batch of 20 students from across north east region. Moreover, NIPCCD actively engages with the research community by providing internship opportunities to students from different universities pursuing research in women, child, and gender issues at various universities and colleges.
- 5. NIPCCD is immensely contributing in the area pertaining to mental health and counselling. During the year 2023-24, the Child Guidance Centres functional at NIPCCD Headquarters and Regional Centres registered a total of 581 new cases, which included comprehensive diagnostic evaluation of child abilities, social adaptation, behaviour, skills, talents, interests, academic learning and personality characteristics. The Adolescent Guidance Service Centre at NIPCCD, which works with the vision of promoting positive mental health of adolescents, registered 93 new cases of adolescents, for various assessments and therapies during the year 2023-24.

- 6. The past year has been nothing short of inspiring. NIPCCD played an integral role along with MWCD in the launch of 'Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi', which was launched on 10 May, 2023 aimed at transforming the Anganwadi Centre into a Learning Centre having high quality infrastructure, play equipment, and well-trained Anganwadi Workers & to bring focus of the Anganwadi system on Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE). To empower the Anganwadi workers and ensure optimal learning for all children including Divyang children, NIPCCD supported the Ministry in developing two curriculum frameworks "Navchetana-National Framework for Early Childhood Stimulation for Children from Birth to Three Years, 2024" and "Aadharshila- National Curriculum for Early Childhood Care and Education for Children from Three to Six Years 2024" under the Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi Programme.
- 7. Furthermore, a strategic MoU with VMMC and Safdarjung Hospital on August 14, 2023, was established to significantly enhance the support system for children with special needs, bridging gaps and ensuring a more efficient and effective pathway from diagnosis to essential therapeutic interventions.
- 8. NIPCCD also proudly supported key Ministry events, including Bharat Parv, International Yoga Day, Veer Bal Diwas (graced by the Hon'ble Prime Minister), and National Girl Child Day, collectively underscoring the Institute's commitment to national priorities for women and child development.
- 9. As Director, I am proud to present Institute's ongoing commitment to research, training, and capacity building, which remains central of our mission of cultivating women and child development of our country. As we reflect upon the significant milestones achieved and the valuable lessons learned, let us look forward with strengthened sense of purpose and intensified commitment to our objectives.

## **Executive Summary**



#### **Executive Summary**

The Training programmes encompassed: Job Training Course, Induction Training, Vertical Training

Programmes, Orientation/Sensitization Courses and Skill Training Programmes, Workshops, and Consultation/Review Meets.

The scope of coverage extended to various schemes and programmes of the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), addressing contemporary, need-based themes.

Impressively, a total of 28526 participants attended 678 Training Programmes from



April 2023- March 2024. Among these programmes, a substantial 18% (123 programmes) were dedicated to enhancing the capacity of Anganwadi Services Scheme functionaries under Umbrella ICDS. **Child Protection Services** vis-à-vis **Mission Vatsalya** emerged as another crucial area with 21% (141 programmes) of the initiatives aimed at addressing issues related to safeguarding children. Additionally, the Institute dedicated 12.7% (86 programmes) of its efforts to programmes concerning **Women's Development**, recognizing the pivotal role that women play in societal progress. Furthermore, NIPCCD organized 17% (115 programmes) to address issues related to **Child Development**, encompassing mental health concerns among children.



The 'Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi' initiative emerged as yet another significant area with an impressive 28.% (192) of the programmes dedicated to early childhood care and education and transformation of Anganwadi Centres into Learning Centres to stimulate the creative, social, emotional and cognitive development of children under six years of age includina Divyang children.

Further, 2.8 % (19) programmes were dedicated to other miscellaneous topics and faculty development programmes which were deemed important as per the need of the situation.

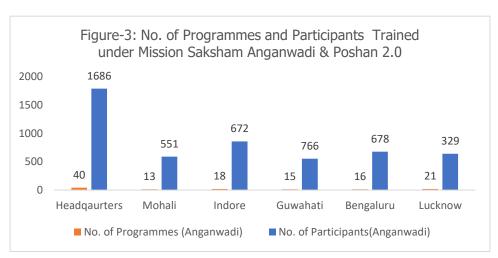
This multifaceted approach underscores the Institute's commitment to a comprehensive strategy, covering aspects crucial for the holistic development of both children and the community at large.

The distribution of programmes reflects a balanced and inclusive agenda, aligning with the broader objectives of promoting social welfare and well-being.

### Capacity Building of Functionaries of Anganwadi Services Scheme under Mission Saksham Anganwadi and POSHAN 2.0

The National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD), functioning as the apex institution for the training of Anganwadi service functionaries, has played a pivotal role in facilitating the successful implementation of Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0. Through its

efforts, concerted NIPCCD has fostered the creation of a convergent ecosystem conducive to the program's objectives. It is noteworthy to mention that NIPCCD (Headquarters and Regional Centers) conducted comprehensive



number of 123 training programmes covering 4732 functionaries, strategically organized to enhance the capacities of Anganwadi functionaries at both headquarters and regional centers. In these programs more focus was put on the topics such as nutrition, early childhood care, education, monitoring, supervision, and community mobilization efforts. Evidently this capacity-building aspect has been instrumental in enhancing the quality and effectiveness of nutrition-related services rendered at the grassroots level. By harnessing the collective efforts and comprehensive capacity building NIPCCD has laid the groundwork for a healthier, more resilient future generation, thereby driving the nation towards inclusive development and socio-economic advancement.

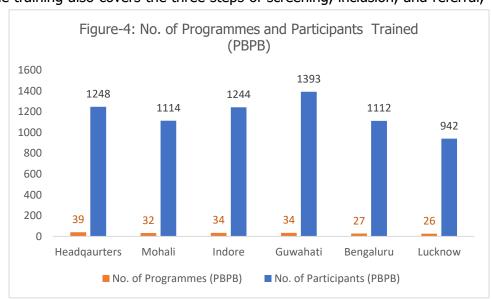
#### Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi

The Union Minister for Women and Child Development, Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani, on May 10, 2023, inaugurated "Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi", the flagship programme of the Ministry. PBPB is a path-breaking ECCE programme designed to help India develop the world's largest, universal, high-quality pre-school network at Anganwadi Centers (AWCs), in alignment with the new National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Under the programme, steps have been taken to bolster early

childhood care and education and good nutrition practices through development and use of 'Do-It-Yourself' (DIY) and locally available toys for learning at AWCs.

A two-tier implementation model is being followed wherein NIPCCD will be training 40618 Master trainers comprising CDPOs, Supervisors and Additional Resource Persons. In the second-tier, these master trainers would be imparting training to 13.1 Lakh Anganwadi Workers in a three-day module across the country through play-based pedagogy covering both nutrition and early childhood education. Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi includes activities around the right to inclusion and also addresses the recently launched Anganwadi Protocol for Divyang Children in November 2023. As per the protocol, the training also covers the three steps of screening, inclusion, and referral,

as well as the roles of different functionaries (DMs, DPOs, CDPOs, Supervisors, and community members) in operationalizing the protocol. Similarly, the recently released **Protocol** for Community Management of Malnutrition (CMAM) has been dulv incorporated in the PBPB Programme.

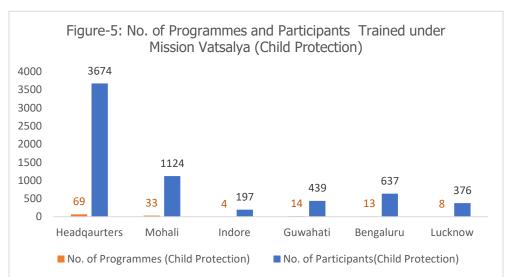


In the year 2023-2024, 192 programmes of SLMTs for PBPB have been organized across NIPCCD Headquarters and Regional Centres with the participation of 7053 functionaries of Anganwadi Services Scheme.

#### **Capacity Building of Child Protection Functionaries under Mission Vatsalya**

Through a series of comprehensive training programs conducted at both national and regional

levels, **NIPCCD** endeavours to standardize and child optimize efforts protection across diverse administrative jurisdictions, thereby fostering a safer environment for children nationwide. **NIPCCD** has demonstrated а

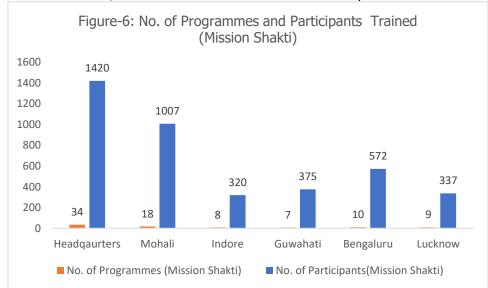


steadfast commitment to child protection through the organization of 141 programmes covering a spectrum of themes crucial to safeguarding children's well-being. In these Training Programmes an impressive number of 6447 participants were trained.

#### **Capacity Building of Functionaries under Mission Shakti**

NIPCCD plays a crucial role in advancing gender equality and women's empowerment. Through extensive research and documentation, NIPCCD aims to understand the complexities of women's

development, providing evidencebased insights to shape policies and interventions that address the real needs of women. Training is at the core of NIPCCD's mission, as conducts diverse programs and workshops to drive forward the agenda

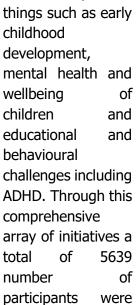


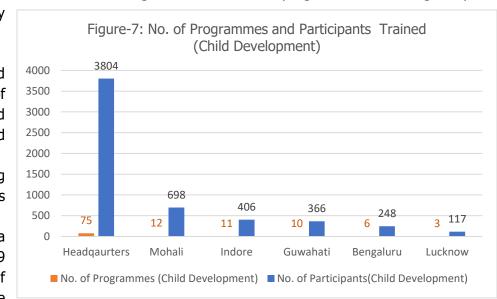
of women's empowerment. NIPCCD organized a total of 86 programs meticulously designed to address women-centric issues in which a total of 4031 participants were trained. These initiatives notably encompassed orientations on the Mission Shakti scheme and its two subsidiary schemes, namely Sambal and Samarthya.

#### **Capacity Building of Functionaries Child and Adolescent Mental Health**

By offering guidance and support to caregivers and educators, NIPCCD endeavours to foster an environment conducive to the holistic growth and well-being of children across various stages of development. The primary emphasis was placed on critical.

In the fiscal year 2023-24, the institute organised a total of 117 programs, each delving into pivotal





trained equipped to deal with various issues like the excessive use of screens by children, nutritional counselling skills and the promotion of correct Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices. These initiatives reflect NIPCCD's proactive approach towards tackling contemporary challenges affecting children's health and development.

#### **Field Demonstration & Counselling Services**

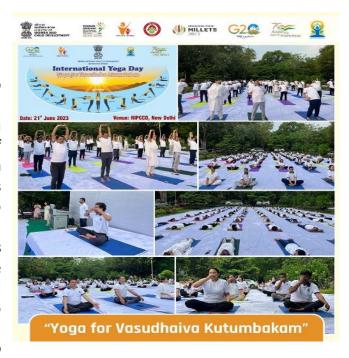
The **Child Guidance Centre (CGC)**, an integral component of the National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD), remains steadfast in delivering high-quality services. In the fiscal year 2023-24, the Child Guidance Centres across regional centres and Headquarters demonstrated its commitment through substantial figures. A noteworthy 581 new cases were officially registered at the Centres, indicative of the persistent need for its services. The Centre's multifaceted approach not only involves direct intervention through new case registrations but also underscores the significance of ongoing support, as evident in the substantial number of follow-up cases. A substantial cohort of 2342 children engaged in follow-up sessions, demonstrating the sustained impact of the interventions provided. A staggering total of 4137 consultations were conducted for children and parents alike.

The **Adolescent Guidance Service Centre (AGSC)** is dedicated to fostering positive mental health among adolescents, with a focus on individuals aged 12-19 years. Embracing a holistic approach through a robust adolescent guidance programme, the Centre actively engages in counselling and supportive interventions to facilitate healthy psychosocial development of young people. In the fiscal year 2023-24, AGSC registered 93 new cases of adolescents seeking assistance. Additionally, the Centre conducted counselling sessions for 269 follow-up cases, ensuring ongoing support for those under its care. Furthermore, AGSC provided a noteworthy 1269 consultations encompassing diverse assessments and therapeutic interventions.

#### **Important Activities**

#### **International Yoga Day**

NIPCCD, New Delhi enthusiastically observed the International Day of Yoga, dedicated to fostering physical and emotional well-being. The vibrant event saw active participation from MWCD officials, emphasizing the significance of holistic health. The celebration resonated with a shared commitment to promoting the benefits of yoga, aligning with the global mission to enhance both physical and emotional wellness. The event served as a platform for unity, as diverse participants came together to embrace the transformative power of yoga for overall well-being. Yoga is a discipline which needs to be practiced physically, mentally and spiritually. Outreach activities were observed at all NIPCCD



Regional Centres for women and children on International Day of Yoga on 21st June, 2023.

#### MoU signed between NIPCCD and Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi

On August 14, 2023, an MoU was inked between Ms. Tripti Gurha, Joint Secretary, MWCD and Director, NIPCCD, and Dr. Vandana Talwar, MS of VMMC and Safdarjung Hospital. #### Roll out of Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi

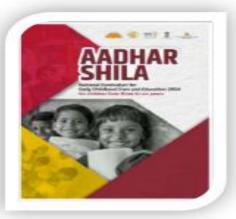
The 'Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi' initiative of Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 was launched on 10 May, 2023 to bring focus of the Anganwadi system on early childhood care and education and transform the Anganwadi Centre into a Learning Centre having high quality infrastructure, play equipment, and well-trained Anganwadi Workers to stimulate the creative, social, emotional and cognitive development of children under six years of age including Divyang children. To empower the Anganwadi workers and ensure optimal learning for all children including Divyang children, this Ministry has developed two curriculum frameworks - "Navchetana- National Framework for Early Childhood Stimulation for Children from Birth to Three Years, 2024" and "Aadharshila-National Curriculum for Early Childhood Care and Education for Children from Three to Six Years 2024" under the Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi Programme.

#### Important Initiative/Programmes under Mission Saksham Anganwadi/Poshan 2.0

Launch of Aadharshila - National Curriculum for Early Childhood Care and Education (3 to 6 years) 2024 & Navchetana - National Framework for Early Childhood Stimulation (Birth to 3 years) 2024 on 11th March, 2024 by MWCD.

The National Education Policy 2020 marked a turning point in India's commitment to shaping a bright future for all children. As 85% of brain development occurs before the age of six years, the Ministry recognizes the pivotal role of early years in development and seeks to strengthen India's Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) landscape. In this endeavour, the Ministry of Women and Child Development launched a National Curriculum for Early Childhood Care and Education for Children from Three to Six Years and a National Framework for Early Childhood Stimulation for Children from Birth to Three Years. For children from age three to six, the National Curriculum for ECCE 2024 covers all domains of development as per the National Curriculum Framework for Foundational Stage 2022 (NCF-FS), including physical/motor, cognitive, language and literacy, socio-emotional, cultural/aesthetic as well as positive habits. For children from birth to three years, the National Framework for Early Childhood Stimulation 2024 aims to empower caregivers and Anganwadi Workers for holistic early stimulation, 7 through responsive caregiving and opportunities for early learning, for optimal development of children, both body and brain. A 36 month-wise age-based activities are provided that can be conducted both within the household as well as at the Anganwadi Centre or Crèche, through all the contact points including home visits, monthly meetings, community-based events, etc. Screening, inclusion and referrals for Divyang children are also provided special focus. The documents have been prepared by the National Institute for Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD), with the support of an Internal Committee.

# TRAINING & CAPACITY BUILDING

#### 1.0 Introduction

The National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD) actively engages in training as a core component of its activities. The training programmes organized by NIPCCD comprehensively encompass major initiatives of the Ministry of Women and Child Development, such as Mission Saksham Anganwadi & POSHAN 2.0, Mission Vatsalya, Mission Shakti and mental health issue of children. In addition to offline programmes, it is significant to note that NIPCCD has expanded its reach by hosting training programs on online platforms as well, thus adopting modern and accessible methods of sharing knowledge.

#### 1.1 Objectives of Training and Capacity Building Programmes:

- 1. Promoting Child Development and protection by strengthening knowledge and skills for the holistic growth, protection and well-being of children;
- 2. Advancing Women Empowerment through capacity building initiatives that strengthen social, economic, and political inclusion;
- 3. Promoting Skill Enhancement to improve the quality and impact of services aimed at child development and women's empowerment;
- 4. Equipping participants with the latest knowledge, tools and strategies to improve the quality of services provided to children, women and vulnerable groups;
- 5. Aiming to strengthen the capacity of professionals to effectively address social challenges and encourage community development by focusing on contemporary policies, innovative practices and research.

#### 1.2 Planning and Development of Annual Training Programmes & Other Initiatives

The Institute formulates its annual training calendar by aligning emerging trends in women and child development with its vision and mission. Key inputs such as findings from the Training Need Assessment (TNA), insights from workshops and conferences, research outcomes, and feedback from previous training programmes are integrated into its design. The identification of offline, online, and vertical (on-field/onsite) training requirements is carried out in collaboration with Regional Centres and State Governments. Additionally, the inputs of different divisions of the Ministry of Women and Child Development play a crucial role in shaping the annual calendar of the Institute. The Institute has been offering a blend of on-campus and off-campus programmes, with approximately 32 per cent of the training conducted online.

To enhance outreach and strengthen the capacities of stakeholders, the Institute employs proven tools for online training delivery. Special emphasis is placed on empowering State and district and block level functionaries through onsite and collaborative programmes. Furthermore, a series of Training of Trainers (ToT) programmes is developed to build the capacities of NIPCCD faculty, State and district resource persons, and master trainers (as additional resource persons like block programme officers, Kendriya Vidyalaya teachers, parents, police officials, JJB members etc.) ensuring an effective cascading model of knowledge dissemination.

#### 1.3 Training Programmes Conducted During 2023-24

During the financial year 2023-2024, the National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD) accomplished a noteworthy milestone by successfully conducting a total of **678 comprehensive programmes**, encompassing both online and offline modalities. These initiatives spanned a diverse array of activities, including orientation courses, sensitization and skill training, workshops, and consultations/review meetings, diligently addressing a spectrum of schemes under the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) and contemporary themes.

The NIPCCD Headquarters played a pivotal role by hosting 257 programmes, while the Regional Centres situated in Mohali, Bengaluru, Guwahati, Lucknow, and Indore collectively organized 421 programmes. This strategic distribution effectively catered to regional training needs in the domain of women and child development. The scope of coverage extended to various schemes and programmes of the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), addressing contemporary, need-based themes.

Among the 678 programmes, a significant emphasis was placed on Capacity Building of Anganwadi Services Scheme Functionaries (including PBPB), constituting 315 programmes (46%). Following closely, 141 programmes (21%) were dedicated to Mission Vatsalya, 86 programmes (13%) delved into issues related to Mission Shakti, 117 programmes (17%) specifically addressed topics related to Child Development, including Mental Health and 19 programmes (3 %) related to the other issues such as Establishing and Management of Voluntary Organisation, records management for in-house NIPCCD officials etc. A visual representation of the thematic areas of training programmes is shown in Figure 8.

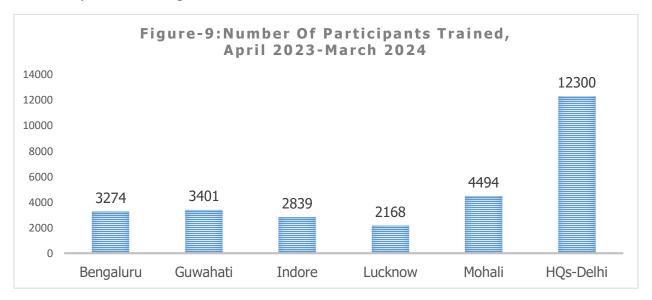

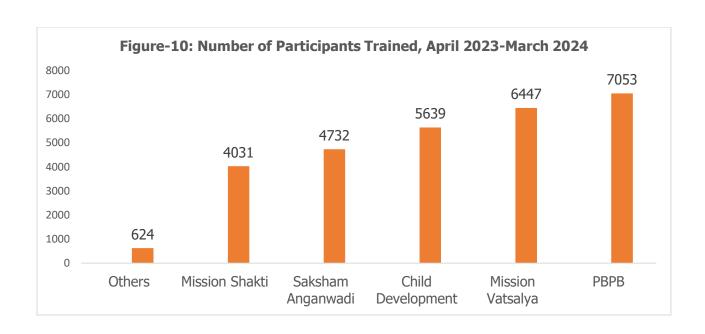
#### 1.4 Target Audience

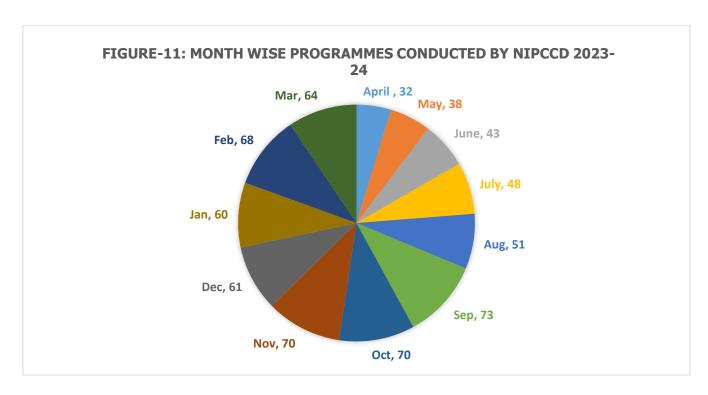

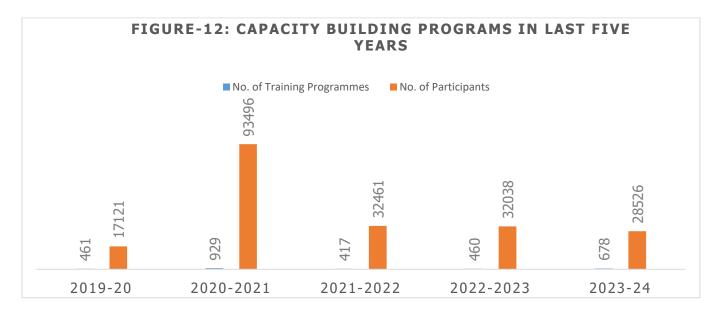
#### 1.5 Month-wise Distribution of Programmes

### 2.0 CAPACITY BUILDING OF FUNCTIONARIES OF MISSION SAKSHAM ANGANWADI & POSHAN 2.0

Children serve as the bedrock of a nation, thus prioritizing their well-being is paramount for the advancement and prosperity of any country. Recognizing this fundamental principle, the Government of India has introduced the Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0. It is an Integrated Support Programme to address the pervasive challenges of malnutrition in children, adolescent girls, pregnant women, and lactating mothers through a strategic shift in nutrition content and delivery and by creation of a convergent eco-system to develop and promote practices that nurture health, wellness and immunity.

The National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD), functioning as the apex institution for the training of Anganwadi service functionaries, has played a pivotal role in facilitating the successful implementation of Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0. Through its concerted efforts, NIPCCD has fostered the creation of a convergent ecosystem conducive to the program's objectives. This ecosystem encompasses various stakeholders and resources, fostering collaboration and synergy to address malnutrition comprehensively.

It is noteworthy to mention that NIPCCD (Headquarters and Regional Centers) conducted a comprehensive number of 315 training programmes (including 192 Programs of PBPB) both offline and online mode, strategically organized to enhance the capacities of Anganwadi functionaries at both headquarters and regional centers. In these programs more focus was put on the topics such as effective execution of Mission POSHAN 2.0, Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi, nutrition, early childhood care, education, monitoring, supervision, and community mobilization efforts. The programmes were designed to address the challenges of transparency, accountability, balanced diets, diet diversity and quality, greater grassroots involvement and last-mile delivery of services supported by key strategies, viz., corrective strategies to address nutrition related deficiencies, nutrition awareness strategies to develop good eating habits for sustainable health and well-being, strategies for communication and development of green eco-systems such as Poshan Vatikas. Evidently this capacity-building aspect has been instrumental in enhancing the quality and effectiveness of Anganwadi-related services rendered at the grassroots level. By harnessing the collective efforts and comprehensive capacity building NIPCCD has laid the groundwork for a healthier, more resilient

future generation, thereby driving the nation towards inclusive development and socio-economic advancement. A brief details of Programmes are as under:

#### 2.1 POSHAN BHI PADHAI BHI

NIPCCD under the aegis of Ministry of Women and Child Development is organizing series of programmes for District Programme Officers, Child Development Project Officers (CDPOs), Supervisors and Additional Resource Persons of the States/UTs on Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi to ensure holistic development of all children under the age of six. This training particularly targets to focus on building the skills of functionaries of Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 in key development domains identified under the National education Policy, 2020. Ministry recognizes the pivotal role of early years in development and seeks to strengthen India's Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) through already established AWCs and therefore PBPB plays a pivotal role in building capacity of AWWs to improve the quality of education in the Anganwadi centers (AWCs), along with a focus on nutrition.



The training is being imparted using a two tier implementation model which is followed throughout the country for training functionaries of Anganwadi Services Scheme in accordance with the recommendations of the Ministry-constituted Taskforce on ECCE, the National Early Childhood Care and Education Curriculum (3-6 years) 2024, and the National Early Childhood Stimulation Framework (Birth to 3 years) 2024.

Under Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi, a total of 7053 participants under **192 State Level Master Trainers Training Programmes on "Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi" (PBPB) participated with the objectives to:** promote early stimulation for the first thousand days and early childhood care and education for the 3 to 6 year age group; develop the capacities of functionaries with a basic



understanding of the ECCE curriculum and pedagogical approaches, to enable them to provide high-quality play-based ECCE training to AWWs; facilitate understanding on the domains of development (physical and motor, cognitive, socio-emotional-ethical,

cultural/artistic), and the development of Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN), as well as related assessments and reinforce participants understanding on nutrition, including Poshan 2.0 and Saksham Anganwadi, innovations in Poshan, Poshan Tracker, feeding practices, SAM/MAM management, micronutrient deficiencies etc.

# CAPACITY BUILDING OF FUNCTIONARIES OF MISSION VATSALYA

#### 3.0 CAPACITY BUILDING OF FUNCTIONARIES OF MISSION VATSALYA

Mission Vatsalya is an initiative launched by the Government of India to promote and protect child welfare across the country. It aims to create a robust child protection mechanism by providing institutional care and support to children who are in need of care and protection. The mission works towards ensuring the overall well-being of children, including their safety, security, education, and health. It is part of the broader umbrella of child protection services under the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD). Key objectives of Mission Vatsalya include: Strengthening Child Protection Services, Improving Existing Shelters and Institutions, Preventive Programs, Rehabilitation and Reintegration, Capacity Building.

NIPCCD plays a crucial role in supporting the implementation of Mission Vatsalya. Through a series of comprehensive training programs conducted at both national and regional levels, NIPCCD endeavours to standardize and optimize child protection efforts across diverse administrative jurisdictions, thereby fostering a safer environment for children nationwide. The institute provides technical assistance, training, and research support to strengthen child welfare programs. NIPCCD conducts training programs for professionals and workers involved in child protection services. This includes social workers, educators, and other personnel working with children in need of care and protection. Furthermore, to support the effective implementation of schemes such as Mission Vatsalya and PM CARES for Children, NIPCCD organized a series of capacity-building programs targeting various stakeholders, with a particular emphasis on District Child Protection Officers (DCPO's), SJPUs, SCPS, JJB members, CCI functionaries etc. with the objective to equip them with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively carry out their responsibilities within the framework of the Mission Vatsalya Scheme.

NIPCCD also develops educational resources and training materials to ensure the effective implementation of child protection initiatives under Mission Vatsalya. The National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD) has demonstrated a steadfast commitment to child protection through the organization **of 141 programmes** covering a spectrum of themes crucial to safeguarding children's well-being. NIPCCD assists in monitoring the implementation of Mission Vatsalya's components across states and provides guidance to ensure that child protection standards are met. The major topics covered in these programmes were as under:

# CAPACITY BUILDING OF FUNCTIONARIES OF MISSION SHAKTI

### 4.0 CAPACITY BUILDING OF FUNCTIONARIES OF MISSION SHAKTI

Mission Shakti is a comprehensive initiative launched by the Government of India in 2022, aimed at empowering women and ensuring their safety and well-being across the country. It is a multidimensional program designed to address the various issues that women face, including violence, economic independence, access to education, healthcare, and social protection. Mission Shakti is divided into two main components: **Sambal (Safety and Security)**: This component focuses on providing protection and safety to women by addressing gender-based violence and ensuring quick responses in cases of emergencies. **Samarthya (Empowerment)**: This part is dedicated to promoting women's empowerment by encouraging them to participate actively in decision-making processes, fostering leadership, and ensuring access to opportunities that enhance their socioeconomic status.

The National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD) plays a crucial role in supporting and implementing various aspects of Mission Shakti. NIPCCD formulates training programmes on gender equality and women's empowerment, legal rights, eentrepreneurship skill, life skill education, development & promotion of micro-enterprise for women, psycho Social Care and counselling for women in distress for stakeholders involved in the implementation of women's safety and empowerment initiatives under Mission Shakti, police officials, civil society organizations etc. This includes building the capacity of One-Stop Centres (OSCs), Shakti sadan, Hub-for empowerment of women, BBBP, PMMVY, Women Helpline and other service providers to support women in distress.

Through extensive research and documentation, NIPCCD aims to understand the complexities of women's development, providing evidence-based insights to shape policies and interventions that address the real needs of women. Training is at the core of NIPCCD's mission, as it conducts diverse programs and workshops to drive forward the agenda of women's empowerment. By equipping individuals and organizations with the necessary knowledge and skills, NIPCCD fosters a supportive environment for women's advancement and contributes to building a more inclusive society.

NIPCCD organized a total of **86 programs** meticulously designed to address women-centric issues. These initiatives notably encompassed orientations on the Mission Shakti scheme and its two subsidiary schemes, namely Sambal and Samarthya. Moreover, the programs prioritized

gender sensitization, with a particular emphasis on combatting Gender-Based Violence. Noteworthy subjects covered included the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act of 2013 and the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act of 2005. These educational endeavors targeted not only government officials but also civil society organizations, aiming to foster a comprehensive understanding and proactive approach towards these critical legislations and their implementation. Through strategic planning and focused execution, NIPCCD sought to empower women, create safer environments, and promote gender equality across various sectors of society. Under Mission Shakti major topics covered by the Institute were as under:

#### 7.0 FIELD DEMONSTRATION AND COUNSELLING SERVICES

The Institute operates comprehensive field demonstration services, catering specifically to the mental health counseling needs of children. These services are not confined solely to its headquarters but extend across regional center, ensuring widespread access to essential mental health support. Additionally, it publishes a variety of materials focusing on topics aligned with its areas of interest. This two-pronged approach aims to offer practical, on-the-ground support for children's mental health while also contributing valuable knowledge and insights through informative publications. Through its commitment to both direct intervention and knowledge dissemination, the institute endeavors to make a positive impact on the mental well-being of children and contribute to a broader understanding of relevant issues.

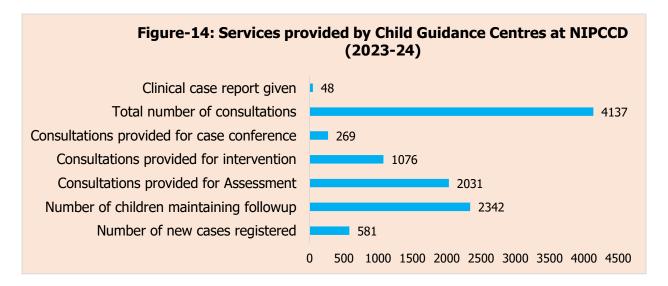
### 7.1 Child Guidance Centre (CGC)

The Child Guidance Centre of the National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development (NIPCCD) serves as the vital hub dedicated to fostering the well-being and development of children. Established with a commitment to addressing the unique needs of young minds, this center specializes in providing expert guidance and counseling services.

Additionally, the center engages in advocacy and community education endeavors to champion the well-being and mental health of children. These efforts involve organizing workshops tailored for teachers, parents and adolescents within the community. Through these workshops, the center strives to promote awareness and understanding, fostering a supportive environment that prioritizes the mental health needs of children.

- During the transitional period spanning from 2023 to 2024, the Child Guidance Centers
  operating within Regional Centers and the central Headquarters exhibited a commendable
  commitment to child welfare. Throughout this timeframe, these centers catered to the needs
  of 697 new registrants, along with 9168 consultations reflecting the ongoing demand for
  their vital services.
- In response to the evolving landscape of child guidance and mental health, the centers adopted a dynamic approach by implementing a thoughtful blend of online and in-person assessment and intervention services. This strategic combination not only showcased adaptability but also recognized the diverse needs and preferences of the families seeking assistance. Beyond the follow up of 795 cases, the centers extended their reach to an

additional 697 children by taking up new cases, therefore, offering various intervention services. This broader engagement underscores the centers' dedication to supporting a comprehensive spectrum of children, acknowledging that each case is unique and requires tailored approaches.



- Counseling centers universally embrace an open-door policy, fostering an inclusive environment for children confronting various difficulties, disabilities, or disorders. Despite this welcoming approach, the nature of conditions disclosed at these centers remains notably challenging. Diverse concerns surface, spanning from intricate learning problems to specific learning disabilities, and encompassing conditions such as Autism Spectrum Disorder and Global Developmental Disorders.
- The multiplicity of reported challenges underscores the significance of these counseling
  centers as comprehensive support hubs. The spectrum of issues reflects the intricate
  tapestry of children's needs and underscores the centers' adaptability in addressing a wide
  array of circumstances. The prevalence of learning problems suggests a critical role in
  educational support, while specific learning disabilities emphasize the need for tailored
  interventions.

#### 7.2 Outreach work

 Child Guidance Center's nationwide not only focus on clinical work but also actively participate in outreach initiatives. These efforts extend to supporting parents, teachers, and adolescents through diverse activities such as workshops, career talks, and on-site interventions for children and caregivers in Child Care Institutions (CCIs). Recognizing the pivotal role of early intervention, these centers emphasize the importance of timely access to healthcare for children. The impact of early treatment is profound, significantly enhancing a child's performance in school while mitigating the risk of adverse outcomes like academic failure and mental health issues.

- By engaging in a multifaceted approach that encompasses both clinical services and outreach programs, the Child Guidance Centers contribute to fostering a holistic environment that nurtures the well-being and development of children. This comprehensive strategy not only addresses immediate clinical needs but also proactively seeks to create a supportive network for parents, educators, and young individuals, ultimately promoting positive long-term outcomes for children's mental health and academic success.
- For instance Training Programme on Supportive Interventions for Children with Learning and Behaviroual Problems was organized on 18-20 September, 2024 by Regional Centre, Mohali with the objectives to: sensitize toward various Learning and Behaviour difficulties in children; and orient toward classroom management of various Learning and Behaviour difficulties in children. Twenty- three participants attended the programme. Similarly, A Workshop on Management of Learning Difficulties was organized on 09 March,2024 by Regional Centre, Guwahati with the objectives to equip educators with practical Strategies and Techniques to effectively manage learning difficulties at home and in the classroom and to provide support in fostering an inclusive learning environment that supports the diverse needs of all children. Fifty three participants attended the workshop.

### **7.3** Workshop for Adolescents

- Ensuring the safe return of adolescents to school and fostering quality learning in a conducive
  environment is of utmost importance. Adolescents merit special attention, emphasizing the
  promotion of a healthy lifestyle. It is crucial to safeguard not only their physical well-being
  but also attend to their psychological and emotional needs. Recognizing this, the significance
  of organizing life skills workshops for adolescents becomes evident.
- Several Training Programmes on Promoting Life Skill Development and Developing Healthy Life Style among Adolescents in CCIs were organised. Similarly, various other training

programs were organized which played a pivotal role in addressing their holistic development, aiming to equip them with essential skills beyond academic realms.

### 7.4 Internship at CGC

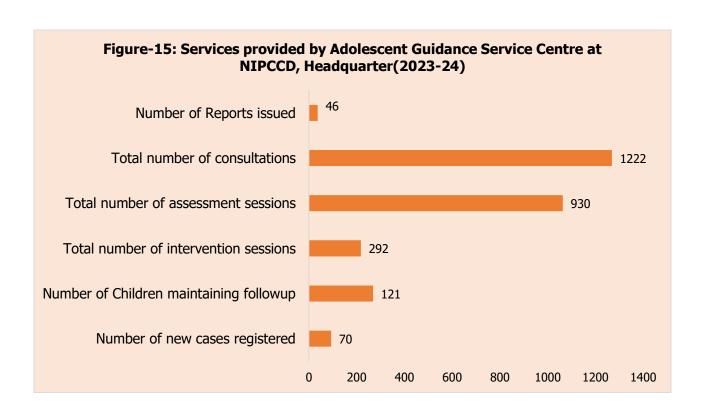
- Child Guidance Centers and Adolescent Guidance & Service Centers, both at the headquarters
  and in regional branches, employ an additional avenue for community engagement through
  internship programs. These initiatives extend mentorship to aspiring students across diverse
  social science disciplines, providing a pivotal platform for experiential learning and skill
  refinement. The primary objective is to cultivate a profound interest in the realm of mental
  health.
- These internships unfold as dynamic opportunities for participants to immerse themselves in various facets of the field. Through active engagement in case discussions, clinical case observations, and exposure to career counseling, students undergo a comprehensive exploration of mental health practices. This hands-on approach enables them to develop a nuanced understanding of the complexities inherent in the discipline. Moreover, interns are afforded the chance to delve into case report writing, scoring, and interpretation. This multifaceted exposure equips them with practical insights into the methodologies employed in mental health assessments. The emphasis on practical skills complements theoretical knowledge, fostering a well-rounded educational experience.
- By providing a real-world context for their studies, the centers contribute to the professional
  development of the next generation of mental health practitioners. The mentorship aspect
  ensures that these budding professionals receive guidance and support from seasoned
  experts, facilitating a seamless transition from academic learning to practical application.

#### 7.5 Adolescent Guidance and Service Center

The heart of AGSC's efforts lies in its comprehensive adolescent guidance program, which seamlessly integrates counseling and supportive interventions. This holistic approach is designed to cater to the nuanced needs of adolescents, recognizing the intricate interplay between mental and emotional well-being during this critical developmental phase.

 The Adolescent Guidance and Service Centre (AGSC) is dedicated to advancing the positive mental health of adolescents through a robust adolescent guidance program. The center

- focuses on fostering the healthy psychosocial development of young individuals aged 12 to 19. In the period spanning 2023-2024, AGSC encountered and addressed a total of 70 new cases involving adolescents who sought support and guidance.
- The center's impact extends beyond initial consultations, with nearly 121 follow-up cases receiving ongoing counseling. This highlights AGSC's commitment to providing sustained support to adolescents as they navigate the complexities of adolescence. The follow-up cases underscore the center's dedication to not only addressing immediate concerns but also ensuring a continuum of care that aids in the enduring mental health of these individuals.
- Furthermore, AGSC facilitated over 1222 consultations, encompassing a diverse array of
  assessments and therapeutic interventions. These consultations exemplify the center's
  versatility in tailoring its services to meet the unique requirements of each adolescent.
  Whether through assessments to understand specific needs or therapies aimed at fostering
  resilience and coping mechanisms, AGSC's interventions are tailored to empower
  adolescents on their journey toward positive mental health.



# Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling

### 8.0 Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance & Counselling (ADCGC)

### ADCGC at NIPCCD, New Delhi in affiliation with Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi

The Institute launched the Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling in the year 2005 to address the need for trained manpower to work in the area of child and adolescent mental health. The course is under affiliation with Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi and is also recognized from Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI). So far the Institute has organized eighteen batches of the course. The Advanced Diploma has been designed to bridge the gap of availability of trained professionals for undertaking counseling and guidance of children and families in different settings. It has been planned with a Developmental, Ecological and Rights Perspective to enable the learner to function effectively as a mental health professional with an updated understanding of theoretical constructs, and the requisite skills. The inherent emphasis of the programme is on 'Development of Self' and 'Acquisition of Skills' through experiential and action learning.

The course envisions to create professional and personal growth opportunities for those working with children and child- related systems so as to enable children to actualize their potential.

Presently Nineteenth batch (XIX) of Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling is running with enrolment of 31 students holding a Postgraduate Degree in Social Work/ Psychology/ Child Development. In addition to regular 28 students, three students from EWS category also availed admission as per Govt. directives in the current batch. Academic Session, End term examination has been completed for the year 2023-24 and Internship process would be completed by December.

### ADCGC at Regional Centre, Guwahati in affiliation with Gauhati University

The Centre inaugurated the one year Advance Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling on October 20, 2021. The course is initiated with the objective to cater to the need for trained mental health professionals and counsellors in the Northeastern Region of India. The diploma is affiliated to Guwahati University. The course is recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) from 2023-2024. The total students' capacity is 20. A total of 20 students are presently pursuing the diploma course.

# Documentation Centre on Women & Children (DCWC)

### 9.0 Library & Documentation Centre on Women and Children (DCWC)

**Library:** The Institute has a full-fledged Library were in there is collection of books on various issues related to Women and Children. The library has a dedicated section for reference books in Hindi. The library of the Institute also subscribes to various International and National Journals. Library provides comfortable reading room to readers where in scholars, academicians, interns and students from other Universities also come to do reference work. The wide collection of books cater to the academic needs of students from many specializations like social work, psychology, women studies, gender studies, public health and nutrition etc.

**Online subscription:** This year a new initiative was taken by the Institute to subscribe to online books. The institute subscribed to Pearson online library for the faculty as well students of Advanced Diploma students at New Delhi and Guwahati. These online books provided easy access to readers related to various subjects pertaining to the work of the Institute. The access to all these books selected by the faculty from all Regional Centres who are subject matter specialist was given and an orientation programme was also organized to facilitate easy access to the online books.

**Library Management software:** The institute's database of books and documents is being managed in the Libsys software. This helps in easy identification of books and documents in the library and DCWC. The entire database of books and documents in the library is also shared with DELNET. The Institute is also a member of Developing Libraries Network (DELNET) which provides inter library loan facility. So the resources of the Institute are also accessed by other academicians through DELNET and books as well as documents are given on loan to the user through this service.

Documentation Centre on Women and Children: The Institute also has a Documentation Centre on Women and Children which is a store house of information related to Women and Children. The centre keeps documents that have been classified as per the taxonomy under various fields like Statistics, Policies, Programmes, Education, Health and Nutrition etc. This centre is an exclusive centre in the country where in documents that includes training modules, workshop/ seminar reports/ research tools, IEC material, guidelines etc. related to women and children can be accessed. The centre serves as a good reference point for faculty of the Institute along with students of Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling. The centre is also used for reference work by scholars doing research work from various Universities. Every year the Institute has students who come for doing their internship in the Institute, these students also access the database of DCWC to explore topics for research and the centre provides them with all the support.

- **9.1.1.** Special Initiatives to collaborate with Colleges and Universities through the Documentation Centre: The institute had been leveraging the online platform for organizing various awareness and orientation programmes on health, nutrition, mental health child protection. So DCWC also got connected to the faculty, students and scholars from various colleges and oriented them on the services offered at the centre. The centre received requests from various scholars for documents and an attempt was made to get the information across to them.
- **9.1.2. Activities during 2023-24:** The following activities were undertaken by DCWC in the area of documentation and dissemination of information during the year 2023-24

### 9.1.2.1 Collection, Documentation and Dissemination of Information from DCWC

During the year 2022-23, DCWC had collected about 100 documents from different sources. The Library also subscribes to 5 foreign journals, 15 Indian journals, 21 magazines and 18 newspapers. The Documentation Centre brings out the following publications on monthly/ quarterly basis under the Project titled 'DCWC Regular Activities'.

- **DCWC News Clips:** This monthly publication is a compilation of newspaper clippings from 18 newspapers of different regions of the country. The DCWC news clip also had keyword search feature and all news related to women and children is compiled. The DCWC news clip is also circulated to the officials of Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- DCWC Content Update: the contents page of the journals subscribed by the Institute are scanned and shared with the faculty and students of Advanced Diploma in Child Guidance and Counselling. This helps the scholars to check out latest research articles from the Journals.
- DCWC Current Awareness: DCWC shares latest documents that are uploaded on the website of Ministries, Organizations and Institutes. These documents include current guidelines, statistics, fact sheets, training modules that are related to women and children.

#### 9.1.2.2 Databases

Database of Documents: All new documents were entered into the computerized
Database of Documents using Libsys library software. The software provides easy access to
information and a computerized list can be easily generated using keywords.

• **Database of Organizations**: This Database contains information collected and updated about government departments, autonomous organizations, research institutes, home science colleges, school/ departments of social work, medical colleges, voluntary organizations, population research centres and international organizations, etc. Regular update is being carried out.









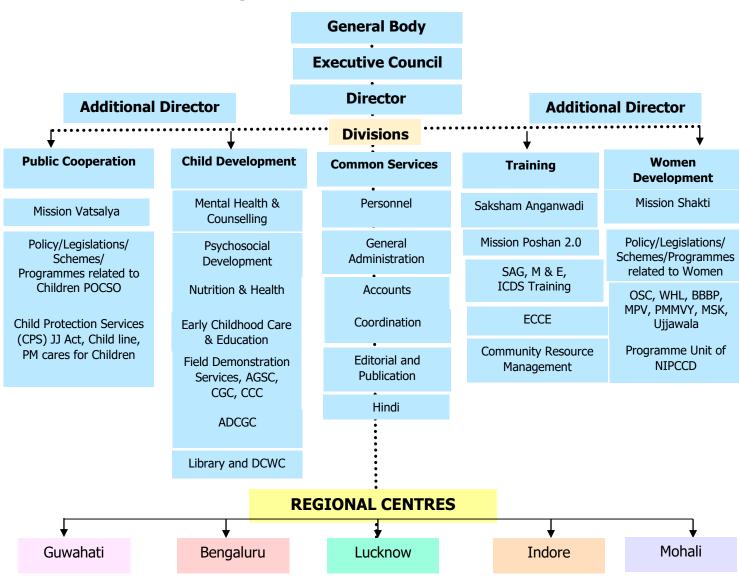

# SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### A. INTRODUCTION:

National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development popularly known as NIPCCD, is a premier organization devoted to promotion of voluntary action research, training and documentation in the overall domain of women and child development. Established in New Delhi in the year 1966 under Societies Registration Act of 1860. It is an Autonomous Body under the aegis of the Ministry of Women and Child Development. In order to cater to the region-specific requirements of the country, the Institute, over period of time, has established five Regional Centres at Guwahati (1978), Bangalore (1980), Lucknow (1982), Indore (2001) and Mohali (2019).

The Institute functions as an apex institution for training functionaries of the Anganwadi Services under Umbrella ICDS. As a nodal resource agency, it has also been entrusted with the responsibility of training and capacity building of functionaries at the national and regional level, under the scheme of Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS). It has also been designated as the nodal institution for imparting training on two important issues of Child Rights and Prevention of Trafficking of Women Children for SAARC Countries by the Ministry of Women and Child Development.

#### **B. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:**

#### 1. General

# **Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements**

- (i) The Financial statements have been prepared and presented under historical cost convention on accrual basis of accounting unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting on going concern basis.
- (ii) The accounts of the Institute are prepared as per the proforma prescribed by the Government of India vide its letter dated 26th May, 1999 wherever applicable to that extent and as further amended by Sixty Eighth meeting of the Executive Council held on 09.02.2016 notified vide Office Order No. NI/Accts./11/5/2015-16 dated 31.03.2016.
- (iii) The Financial statements include the financial statements of Headquarter (Delhi) and Regional Centre's at Guwahati, Bengaluru, Lucknow, Indore and Mohali.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The Preparation of financial statements requires the management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) as of date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses for the reporting period. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable.

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# 2. Revenue Recognition

- (i) The sources of funds of the organization is primarily the grant received from Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. Grants received to meet the expenditure on capital nature (to the extent utilized in the year) are treated as Capital Fund. Grants for meeting the revenue expenditure are treated as income of the year in which they are realized, except that they will be treated as accrued income where sanctions have been issued up to the last day of the year and there is reasonable certainty of collection and realization.
- (ii) Bank Interest are accounted on receipt basis. Classroom and Hostel Charges, Fees received from ADCGC Students, Fee received from the participants as Registration. Charges and misc. receipts are treated as liability of the Institute and refundable to Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- (iii) The unspent balances of Grants, interest earned on Saving Bank Account are refundable to MWCD in the succeeding year after the audit, unless otherwise stated.
- (iv) Interest in investment of CPF/ GPF Funds has been accounted on accrual basis.

### 3. Fixed Assets and Depreciation

- (i) Fixed Assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. Costs directly attributable to acquisition are not capitalized until the assets are ready for use, as intended by the management.
- (ii) Assets acquired out of sponsored projects funds are treated as Institute's Assets.
- (iii) Assets received as Gratis from various agencies are treated as assets of the Institute and valued at cost, by corresponding credit to Capital Reserve.
- (iv) No Assets have been revalued during the year

## (b) Depreciation

- (i) Depreciation on Fixed Assets is charged at the rates prescribed under Income Tax Act, 1961 on written-down value method.
- (ii) Assets costing less than Rs.10,000 and Books Periodicals-Depreciation is charged at the rate of 100% since 2003-2004.
- (iii) Depreciation on various Fixed Assets received as Gratis is charged at the rate of 20% since 2003-2004 as decided by the Management.

#### 4. Investment

Investments, being of permanent nature, is carried at cost.

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# 5. Employee Benefits

# (i) Short Term Benefits

Short term benefits like salary, allowances expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognized as an expense during the period when the employees render the services.

### (ii) Defined Contribution Plan

The Institute's contribution to defined contribution schemes such as Contributory Provident Fund, New Pension Scheme are charged to the income and Expenditure Accounts as and when incurred.

#### (iii) Defined Benefit Plan

The Institute also provides gratuity benefits to the employees, which is also charges to Grant received from the Govt. of India. As approved by the Executive Council in it's Meeting held on 31 March 2004, the liability in respect of gratuity, pension and leave encashment up to the year end is determined by actual valuation made by the Institute.

#### C. NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India has released Rs.6,695.23 Lakh as Grant-in-Aid during the financial year 2023-24 for activities under the following budget heads:

- 2. The Institute acknowledges the liability towards any expenditure at the time when it has been approved by the Competent Authority for payment and accordingly deducts TDS and GST at that time. As such, Institute has not deducted TDS on the provisions of expenditure made during the financial year 2023-24.
- 3. Some fixed assets of the Institute were revalued in the year 2003 and 2004, however assets as per valuation report with books of accounts have been adjusted accordingly along with the corresponding adjustment in Deprecation.
- 4. Central Project Support Unit (CPSU) of Rural Women's Development and Empowerment (Swa-Shakti) Project had been shifted to NIPCCD w.e.f. 01.07.2002. As per the agreement with Ministry of Women and Child Development, the bank account related to CPSU would be maintained by the Institute. The Institute would release the funds to CPSU on receipt of funds from the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. on India. Now, the CPSU unit has been closed wef. Dec 2005 and unspent balance of Rs.39.99 Lakh only lying in the Bank of CPSU which will be transferred to NIPCCD on close of Account on the receipt of approval from MWCD.

- 5. Rs.1.82 Lakhs has been shown as "Suspense Account" in the Balance Sheet under the head Current Assets represents the amount misappropriated by a former cashier Shri H.C. Chhangra and the matter is still sub judice.
- 6. The MWCD had taken a decision to open a new Regional Centre at Raipur for which Government of Chhattisgarh had allotted land free of cost.
  - Advance to PWD Raipur amounting to Rs.38.04 lakhs for construction of boundary wall in earlier years is reflected under the head "Advance to PWD Raipur" in Loans and advances (Refer Schedule- 8). The same is yet to be adjusted.
- 7. The institute has given advances to CPWD for various ongoing civil works. Advances to CPWD amounting to Rs.589.64 lakhs remain outstanding at the end of the financial year, have been reflected under the head Loans and Advances (Refer Schedule -8). The same is yet to be adjusted.
- 8. The Institute created a provision of Rs.5.51 lakhs in earlier years. It is represented as provision for capitalization of assets under Current Liabilities and Provision in Balance Sheet (Refer Schedule-4). The same is yet to be adjusted.
- 9. The Institute had spent Rs.113.11 lakhs on the project "NCF Hausla 2019". The file of this program for sanctioning of Final Expenditure is under submission to MWCD. The amount will be settled post final approval from MWCD. The same is shown under the head Sundry Debtors Projects (Refer Schedule-9).
- 10. User Charges Liability of Rs.685.86 Lakh relating to earlier years remained unpaid to the MWCD Further Rs.127.19 Lacs received by the Institute in the current year also remained unpaid. The total amount of Rs.813.05 lakhs have been reflected under the head Current Liabilities. (Refer Scheduled-4).
- 11. Institute has given advance of Rs.45.40 Lakh to its employees out of which, Rs.20 lakh are subjudice and remaining Rs.25 lakh remain unadjusted. (Refer Schedule-8)
- 12. The balances under Sundry Creditors (Schedule 3) and Sundry Debtors (Schedule 9) are mostly dues/receivables from various government department(s). Similarly, the balances from Loan and Advances (Schedule 8) and Current liability (Schedule 4) are not confirmed and are pending for approval of necessary adjustment from the concerned department.
- 13. Contingent Liability: Ex-employee(s) of the Institute has filed a case in the Delhi High Court against his dismissal. Under directive issued by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi an amount of Rs.4.91 Lakhs was deposited with the respective authorities shown as Deposit against Contingent Liability under Schedule 8 of Annual Accounts. As per direction of the Court, Rs.20.00 Lac has been paid to Dr. Tejinder Kaur as interim payment, which reflect as outstanding under Contingent Advance.
- 14. The Institute utilizes the Capital Grant for the purchases of fixed assets and treated it as Capital Fund. However, to comply with instructions received from Ministry of HRD vide D.O Letter no.1703/JS & FA (HRD)/2/2002 dated 19th March 2002 the Institute has started charging depreciation on cost of assets (Refer Accounting Policy No.3). The Depreciation is not routed through Income and Expenditure as the entire cost of assets has already been reduced from grant received by it in the year of purchase. The above is only for disclosure purpose and has been shown by way of deduction from assets (Schedule No.7 and 12) and from Capital Fund (Schedule 1 and 5).

15. The Investment under CPF/GPF is made only in Government related securities and debt related securities as per pattern prescribed by the Ministry of Finance. No investment is made by Institute in Equities as prescribed by Government of India.

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- 16. Taxation
  - In view of there being no income taxable under the Income Tax Act, 1961, no provision for Income tax has been considered necessary.
- 17. The Institute accounts its liability of retirement and terminal benefits on estimated basis every year and the provisions for retirement benefits for the year 2023-24 is Rs.890.47 Lakh
- 18. Previous Year figures have been re-grouped, re-casted and re-arranged wherever considered necessary.
- 19. 'Schedule-1' to 'Schedule-20' form an integral part of the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account and have been duly authenticated.
